



FROM THE DIRECTOR:

There's always something **NEW** springing up at your Library!

Brand **NEW** and hot off the presses, the Library now offers free access to the **New York Times Online** newspaper. Drop expensive subscriptions and find news through the Library. It's free to use after setting up your own *NYT Online* account through the Library's website.

In programs, join us for the second session of the **NEW** Wild Side series about nature on our San Juan islands. In January, Wolf Hollow Wildlife Rehabilitation Center's Shona Aitken told and



showed us about critters who go bump in the night with a program on *Nocturnal Animals*. In addition to slides, stories, and Shona's terrific demonstrations of owl calls, we touched feathers, wings, talons, skulls, and learned about the animals the Center rescues.

On April 15th Shona will return with another **NEW** session, *New Life—Wild Babies*, just in time for the **NEW** wildlife appearing on our islands this Spring, and we'll learn how we can help protect them. Perhaps we'll also debate the eternal question: Which animal babies are the cutest?

Later this year, Russel Barsh and friends from KWIÁHT: Center for the Historical Ecology of the Salish Sea will educate us on San Juan Islands wildflowers and pollinators, and then about our strange but often delicious local mushrooms and fungi.

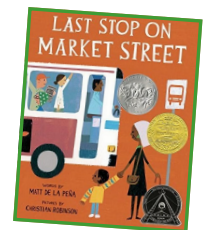
AWARD - WINNING TITLES FOR CHILDREN AND TEENS

Each year the American Library Association announces the winners of distinguished literary awards for children and teens. This year's winners include a variety of subjects and are now available for checkout at the Library.



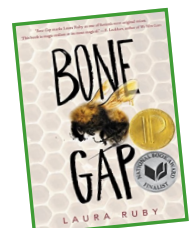
The Caldecott Award for most distinguished American picture book went to ... *Finding Winnie: The True Story of the World's Most Famous Bear*

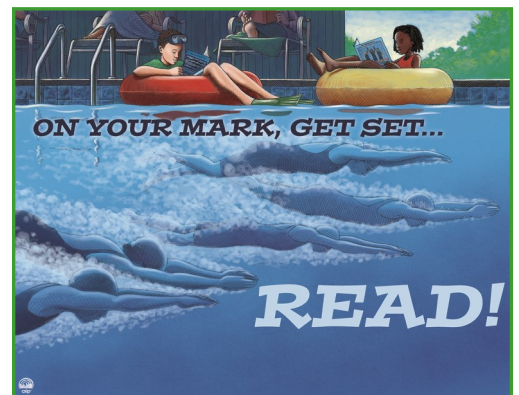
