FROM THE DIRECTOR

I wrote in the last Library newsletter that libraries are still Although we were worried we wouldn't have enough relevant in this digital age. And then a few days later, the underwater CenturyLink cable providing telephone and internet service to most islanders was damaged offshore from Lopez Island. As news got out that the Library still had internet service, the parking lot guickly filled, and soon every chair inside the library was occupied.

Library users were using their laptops and Bluetooth technology to Skype for business communication, banking and other essential economic activity. Others, who simply could not work when businesses closed due to lack of internet connectivity, visited the Library to connect with family on Facebook, watch movies on YouTube, or borrow books.

By the second day of the internet service disruption, Library staff set up extra tables, chairs and power strips, and again tables quickly filled with islanders using their laptops and tablets for business and entertainment. More than twice as many people visited the library as during a usual day. And it was silent. Everyone was so intent on focusing on their screen that the Library was eerily guiet. Many people, however, greeted old friends while browsing available books and movies.

computers for all the visitors, we were mostly able to meet the demand, thanks to our reservation system and tweaking the way we provide internet access to non-Library computers. The San Juan Island Chamber of Commerce gave the Library a 2013 True Grit award for efforts to keep islanders connected.

We aim to help you with your technology needs. The Library has resources about specific devices and applications. We provide free WiFi connectivity, and we provide workshops and one-on-one training to help use Library technologies like online databases or eBooks.

HELPING WITH YOUR TECHNOLOGY LEARNING NEEDS



The Library is offering technology training to help you learn the skills you need to be a 21st century citizen. Technology is changing so fast today, it is a struggle to keep up.

To help you keep abreast, the Library has offered three workshops in using eBooks on your digital devices (see *photo above*), be they iPads, Kindles or something else. We're offering a series of workshops called Get Started Using Computers that covers the basics like using the mouse, copy and paste, finding your files and sending email with attachments.

Another way to keep learning is to study online. Independent learning allows you to move at your own pace and choose to focus on learning what is important to you. Thanks to a partnership developed by the Washington State Library, Microsoft technology training is now available through many libraries in the state, including the San Juan Island Library. You can study to become a systems administrator, learn Word or Excel, or just brush up on the latest versions of Office applications, all at your own pace, for no charge, using any computer with internet access. Ask at the information desk to get started.

Another technology training website that many will find useful is offered by the Goodwill Community Foundation at <u>www.gcflearnfree.org/topics</u>. There you will find interactive tutorials for all kinds of technology skills from basic to more advanced computer skills, digital photography, Skype, and even how to use an iPhone or social media.

We are open to suggestions for workshops you'd like to see, and we are also looking for volunteers to help present those workshops. Contact the Library outreach coordinator, Beth Helstien, if you'd like to volunteer to help or there is something you want to learn.

We'll have more workshops soon, including a Gadget Menagerie program in March. WE HAVE AN APP FOR THAT - LIBRARY NOW.

Download an eBook? Find information fast? We have an app for that!

The Library recently launched *Library Now*, a mobile app to put the library at your fingertips. From any mobile phone or tablet connected to the internet you can instantly tap into library resources, anytime, anywhere. You can search the Library catalog, check your account, ask a question, find events, and more.

To access the Library's mobile app, point your device to <u>http://wa.boopsie.com</u>, or search *Library Now* in your mobile device's app store and download the app today. It's free!

"Our mobile app puts library information just one click away with much faster access than going through a browser," said Laurie Orton, Library director.

Searching the catalog with the mobile app is especially easy. Just type the first few letters of two or three words and search results will begin to appear. Once you find the title you're looking for, you can place it on hold right from your phone.

The app offers additional features, such as BookLook[™] that lets you scan an ISBN barcode anywhere you are to see if the Library owns the title. Just scan the ISBN, see if the Library owns it and—if we do—place a hold on it right from your phone. How cool is that?


