SJI Library Imagine Your Story Summer Friends.

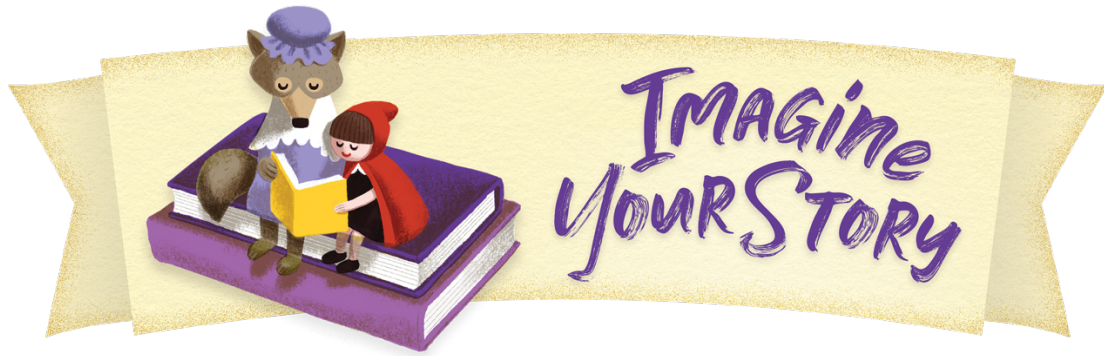

Fridays at 11 am: Online Fairytales & Fables with Miss Melina, Miss Kathy and Miss Jenni

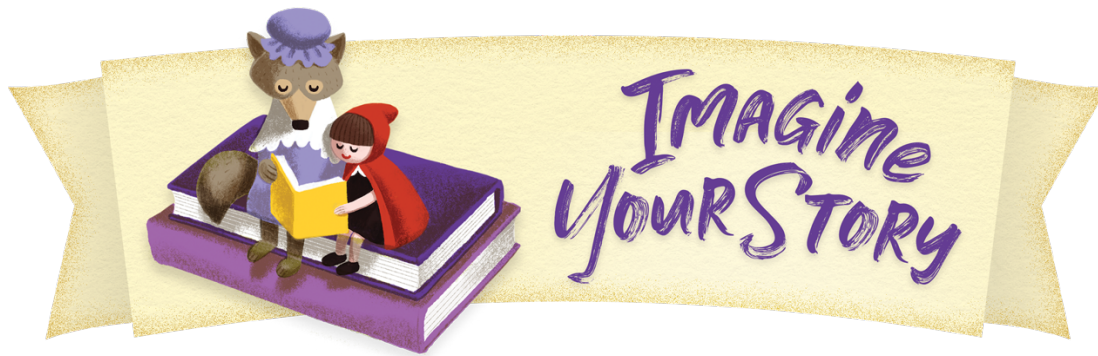
- For your listening enjoyment, we'll read fairytale and fable classics that have delighted audiences for centuries.

Step 1: Gather rocks and paint them with words of hope and inspiration to sprinkle about our community. As you leave a rock, take a photo and email it to youthservices@sjlib.org with a clue on how to find it. Then, we'll post it to our social media pages for others to enjoy!

Step 2: See how many inspirational rocks you can find throughout our community based on clues left by others. It's a great way to get outdoors with the kids on a giant scavenger hunt or geocache-like adventure.

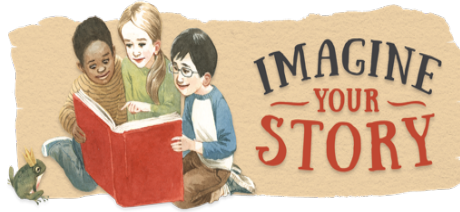

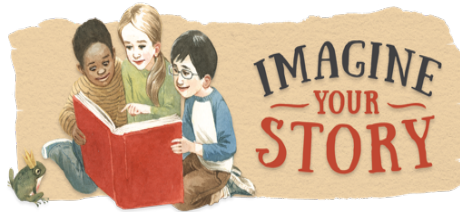
