



"What's happening with the Library's building plans?" is a question we're hearing often at the Library and around the community.



OCMI has been assisting the Library's Board of Trustees in considering properties in and around town, building a list of viable options. Next we'll have feasibility studies done on the preferred sites. The results will help inform the board's final decision in identifying an optimal site for a new library building.

The goal of the new Library is to expand space for services and collections, and fill and anticipate current and future needs of a modern community. From pre-school literacy to teen activities, from technology to guest speakers, the Library is central to keeping our community connected. We envision a library that will serve the changing needs of this community for decades to come.

Stay tuned for more updates as we go forward. There will be opportunities for community involvement in the coming months.



WHAT'S HAPPENING AT YOUR LIBRARY?

The San Juan Island Library, along with the Lopez and Orcas libraries and the San Juan Island National Monument, received a San Juan County Lodging Tax Grant to support a four-part Coast Salish Speaker Series focusing on connecting current residents and visitors to the San Juan Islands with the Native history of this region. The first of these speakers, Saanich activist, storyteller, and musician Paul 'Che oke ten' Wagner presented on Saturday, March 30th. The next speakers will be US Army veteran, violinist, storyteller, and member of the Lummi Nation, Swil Kanim, at 7 pm on Friday, May 17th and Lummi Elder William John X'welwelat'se in June.

The ever-popular Know Your Islanders talks continue to explore trails and traveling on the first Monday of the month. This year we've experienced such diverse destinations as Mont Blanc, Designing Hawaii, and the Sea as Inspiration for Art and Science. Just ahead on the trail: Paul Walsh, Space Case: Travels to Space (Monday, June 3rd).

Ready for a walk on the Wild Side? Learn about the Island Marble Butterfly with Jenny Shrum (Wednesday, June 12th), local berries with Thor Hanson, (Wednesday, July 10), and island reptiles and amphibians with Christian Oldham (Wednesday, July 17th).



We've already had a broad miscellany of events this year: San Juan Historical Museum's Show and Tell; Illustrating Children's Books; Humanity Washington Speaker Tessa Hulls' 'She Traveled Solo'; and even an inflatable Planetarium!

There was a workshop on Self-Publishing in February and another on Memoir Writing in May, and two melodious pop-ups: St. Valentine's Day with the Island Chordsmen Plus and St. Patrick's Day with Mike Cohen.

Stay tuned for two wonderful genealogy events: author Candace Wellman's workshop on researching cross-cultural marriages (Wednesday, June 26); and a 3-part workshop on researching your family history with genealogist Robin Jacobson in November.






2018 REVENUE AND EXPENDITURES

Wi Fi? Why not? WiFi Hotspots at the San Juan Island Library

The Library is launching a lending collection of WiFi Hotspots to make internet access available to islanders. People over the age of 18 can check out a hotspot device for three weeks to receive internet service via a cell tower. The program is free of charge, and is partially supported by a generous grant from the San Juan Island Community Foundation.



Wifi Hotspot

As people grow increasingly dependent on the internet for both work and recreation, providing the community with access to WiFi hotspots becomes more and more important. Educational programs, including those available for free through a library account, require internet access, and streaming video has become a regular pastime.

The experience of other libraries across the country has shown that lending hotspots is a valuable, popular, and growing need for rural communities like ours.
