With the lessons of 2020 behind us, we launched into 2021 with newfound awareness, curiosity, and flexibility. As a Library and staff we leaned into change and found new opportunities for innovation and fresh perspectives.

The San Juan Island Library remained a community hub throughout COVID, circulating materials and resources through curbside delivery and our curbside pick-up window; registering 430 new patrons for library cards; providing patrons with access to databases, ebooks, audiobooks, and more; expanding our collections to provide games and puzzles, WiFi hotspots, and laptops kits; and providing our community with rich and robust virtual programming and take-and-make kits for all ages.

As we look to the year ahead, we are grateful for the ongoing support of our community, the Board of Trustees, and the Friends of the Library. Thank you for supporting us in our mission to bring people together and empower islanders to discover life's possibilities!




2021 Highlights



Motivated by our desire to support our entire community and ensure that all islanders have access to the Library and its dynamic offerings, SJIL was thrilled to enact COVID-Relief Amnesty for library patrons. Billed charges on patron accounts accumulated between January 2016 and December 2020 were fully removed.



With over 399 Summer Reading Program (SRP) kits delivered to participants, readers from young to old celebrated the joy of reading and community! The 2021 SRP was one of our biggest to date. packed to the brim with more than 16 programs, 9 outreach events, and over 390 attendees. Over 125 Take & Make craft kits were distributed and 90 early literacy kits were delivered to local WIC families



Welcoming in Halloween with bookish flare, SJIL partnered with the Joyce L. Sobel Family Resource Center and other community organizations to create a safe, enriching, space for families and little ones to hear stories, wear costumes, enjoy Halloween festivities, and receive a book to keep!



2021 marked our inaugural StoryWalk® installation, featuring Thor Hanson's Bartholomew Ouill: A Crow's Ouest to Know Who's Who. A StoryWalk® is a creative way for children and adults to combine reading with spending time outdoors. An illustrated picture book is placed along a popular walking path for people to enjoy, step-by-step and page-by-page!

From plant swaps to historic walking tours and whale poop sniffing pups to firefighter storytime, SJIL brought a diverse array of programs to the community in 2021! Combining in-person and virtual programming allowed us to connect with farreaching speakers and specialists, teaching us about our island's ecosystem, hobbies, interests, literacy, and


