## New Library Digital Collection Celebrates Local Islander's Stories

(Friday Harbor, WA) –July 25th, 2025,

The San Juan Island Library, in collaboration with Kira Joy Williams, one of Alchemy Art Center's Artists-in-Residence, is excited to announce the creation of a new local digital collection celebrating the Home is in the Stories project. The entries were part of a larger project facilitated Williams during her 2025 Artist-in-Residence at the Alchemy Art Center.

The islanders who participated in this project engaged in reflection about what makes the island home and then were either interviewed or created a collage about theirs or a partner's story. These stories, created within communities, explores the ways in which individuals and groups engage in placemaking, and the varied cultural touchpoints that construct a concept of a home. The project was inspired by experiences in Williams's life. "I was inspired by a desperate attempt to salvage my grandma's memories as she struggled with dementia." Williams said, "I realized how important her storytelling was to the formation of my identity, which led to my interest in the impact of preserving individual and collective stories of home within communities."
